Infant Safe sleep continues to be an issue in Anne Arundel County-

- CFR Community Member obtained a grant from the Lothian Ruritans and South County Baby Food Pantry for purchasing 10 pack and plays for the Annapolis Family Support Center.

-CFR Chairperson- Dr. Rice held an in-service for AAMC Pediatricians on May 15, 2012 with guest speaker, Dr. Scott Krugman from Franklin Square Hospital. The topic of the presentation was “Reducing Infant Mortality through Nursery Interventions.” The presentation was well attended. There was some discussion about have a “Parental Safe Sleep Contract” at AAMC and BWMC.

- Nurses from the Department of Health provided parent education at various health fairs on SIDS/SUDI, safe sleeping and shaken baby syndrome prevention.

Suicide Prevention/Grief Counseling:

- Students (siblings or close friends of infant/child death cases) received monitoring and counseling at their public schools. School Guidance Counselors & Psychologists provided bereavement and grief counseling. Crisis Response was also involved.
- **QPR Training of Elementary School Teachers-** AA County Public Schools are in their 3rd year of the Garrett Lee grant. The Youth Suicide Awareness Group extended the QPR training for one more year. All elementary schools, middle schools and high schools trainings for faculty and staff have been completed. They have 75 trainers and trained approximately 8,500-10,000 employees.
- **Suicide Attempt Surveillance-** Dr. Chan developed a suicide surveillance form for hospital emergency rooms to possibly utilize. Dr. Chan is working with MHA and local Emergency Departments (2 hospitals in county) on how to collect data in order to look at risk factors for adolescent suicide attempts
- **Suicide Prevention-** Nick Silvestri and Sarah Montgomery of AA County CFR gave a presentation on YSA at the Annual Suicidology Conference in Baltimore called “Collaborations in Suicidology: Bridging the Disciplines” that was held April 18-21, 2012.

Drowning Initiatives

CFR along with DOH Environmental Health (EH) permits & AA County Fire Department developed a pool safety checklist that is issued upon pool permits. Safety measures to prevent drowning was incorporated into EH information given out to residents about residential swimming pool requirements as related to the County Property Maintenance Code. Previously, this information only included references to the code, not best practice as relates to drowning prevention. As they become available, they will be reviewed.</p>
4. How many of the 2012 referred cases were entered into the MD Child Death Review System database? (If any were not entered, please explain why.)	<p>Of the 43 cases reviewed, 15 have been entered into the CDR cases. The remaining 28 cases will be entered into the database by April 15, 2013. They have not yet been entered due to changes we have been making to our internal systems for tracking case information and completing data entry. Data for the 15 cases entered is under review to ensure consistency in the way data is entered and any inconsistencies will be correct by April 15, 2013.</p>

In 1 additional case, a CPS investigation is open and a finding has not yet been made.</p>

In 1 additional case, a child was determined to have had a previous history of abuse or neglect, but CPS could not determine which. In 6 cases, previous history of abuse is unknown due to lack of information provided by DSS.</p>

Sleep-Related Infant Deaths

In 2012, the number of sleep-related infant deaths decreased for the third year in a row, which is unprecedented in Baltimore City. The B'more for Healthy Babies (BHB) initiative, launched in 2009, continues to highly prioritize prevention of these deaths. In 2012, we took the following actions:

Safe Sleep Education:

- We worked with two additional birthing hospitals to show the BHB safe sleep video so that the video is now being shown in all eight birthing hospitals in the city as of April 1, 2013.
- We have filmed two additional safe sleep videos, one in English that targets fathers, grandparents, and other caregivers and one in Spanish that addresses the growing immigrant population in East Baltimore. These videos are based on needs identified during case reviews. The videos will be released in May 2013 and disseminated through radio and print ads and through community partners.
- We partnered with the Baltimore Ravens to film a PSA with player LaQuan Williams and his family on safe sleep education targeted to fathers. The PSA is being shown on television and online, through home visiting programs, in jury duty and Central Booking, and in DSS offices.
- BHB continues to distribute educational materials to women in the community and to providers through community events (such as Baby Fest in Patterson Park) and our Rattle & Roll Day in which BHB staff blanket OB clinics in the city with materials.
- We made revisions to the Safe Sleep Environment checklist procedures used by city home visiting providers to ensure that providers observe the sleeping area and sleep-related data and protocols were reviewed.
- Dr. Stephanie Regenold continues to provide on-site training to health care professionals and home visiting providers on safe sleep. We continued to send letters to birthing hospitals when a sleep-related death occurred to a mother giving birth there and offered trainings. In addition, we are having individual meetings with all eight hospitals and sharing data on sleep-related deaths to determine how we can partner (four meetings

conducted to date).

- We are in the process of revising our online Safe Sleep Toolkit for providers with updated strategies and statistics in Baltimore City.
- A Preventive Medicine Resident from Johns Hopkins was designated to identifying strategies for outreaching providers on the Prenatal Risk Assessment, which links pregnant women to safe sleep education and home visiting services. We are working with DHMH to outreach providers.

Smoking:

Based on data gathered by the CFR team, we identified that prenatal and secondhand smoke was a factor in the majority of sleep-related infant deaths in 2012. Oftentimes, the mother is not smoking but household members are.

- We continued promoting the BHB “Just Hold Off” social marketing campaign launched in 2011, which emphasizes the importance of not smoking around pregnant women and infants.
- We are partnering with Dr. Gregory Diette, Director of Clinical Research in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Johns Hopkins in order to launch a pilot program in which air cleaners are placed in homes in which infants and pregnant women are exposed to secondhand smoke.
- We are incorporating activities on smoking cessation and avoiding secondhand smoke exposure into Baby Basics Moms Clubs, community-based prenatal care education classes offered in Baltimore.
- Our BHB Preventing Substance-Exposed Pregnancies Task Force is implementing the Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral, and Treatment (SBIRT) program in home visiting, WIC, family planning, and other venues and training providers on motivational interviewing to increase smoking cessation rates.

Data Collection and Case Review

- The CFR Coordinator is in the process of revising each agency’s data collection forms to ensure that complete information is available for each review and fewer cases need to be carried over to the next meeting.
- Starting with 2013 cases, we will be tracking certain data points over time; for example, the team identified repetition of 9th grade as a common factor in many teen deaths, so we will track grade repetition to help the team identify recommendations for the school system.
- We have continued to analyze and report on sleep-

	<p>related infant deaths using our Safe Sleep Profile, which tracks several data points for these deaths (e.g., bed-sharing, smoke exposure, day of the week) to inform actions. We developed a similar profile for motor vehicle accidents and are developing one for homicides.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A representative from Healthy Start now attends case reviews of sleep-related infant deaths. <p>Homicides</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Intimate partner violence appears to have been a risk factor in homicides of infants and young children. We are investigating strategies to more effectively screen for IPV through home visiting and other maternal and child health programs. • The team took action reclassify a Sudden Unexplained Death of a Child to homicide based on information revealed at the meeting. <p>Fire-Related Deaths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Health Department is now including messaging about storing combustibles nearing radiators and other heating devices in seasonal and Code Blue weather alerts. <p>Other</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Creation of a resource guide for school staff on mental health services referrals.

2012 CFR actions included:

- 1) Development of a Toddler Bathtub Safety Brochure adapted from the Goodyear, AZ, Fire Department brochure. Montgomery County's Early Childhood Center (Nancy Curtis, CFR member) funded the printing of approximately 500 brochures & distributed them to child care centers & the community via health partners.
- 2) MCPS Staff (Pam Montgomery, CFR Member) contacted high schools to ensure that suicide prevention hotline numbers are prominently displayed in health rooms.
- 3) CFR support staff shared information about a new SAMHSA toolkit for suicide prevention with our CFR Team & school nurses.
- 4) CFR support staff explored adding links to CFR resources & related materials on the Montgomery County DHHS website. (still in discussion)
- 5) CFR utilized FIMR / CAT resources to print / distribute safe sleep & infant safety materials throughout the community via partners & health fairs.
- 6) CFR support staff compiled & shared relevant news, training, & conference opportunities with team members.
- 7) Montgomery County Crisis Center staff initiated a new protocol related to long-term follow-up for families who have experienced suicide.
