Proclamation

From the Governor of the State of Maryland

BREASTFEEDING MONTH AUGUST 2020

- WHEREAS,** *Breastfeeding is a universal solution that enables everyone the same, fair start in life, preventing hunger, malnutrition, and food insecurity. Responsible consumption of a mother's milk alone is the healthiest food for her infant during the first six months of life, and in combination with family foods during the second six months of life or longer; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Enabling women to breastfeed protects our planet! Breastfeeding is a non-polluting, renewable baby food source, ecologically nurturing the mother-infant bond and ensuring environmental sustainability; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Workplace milk expression enables employed breastfeeding mothers to enhance breastfeeding success, while also sustaining the economy, as employers benefiting from improved staff productivity and morale, lower health insurance costs, and less missed work days by the parents; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Sustainable communities arise from the foundation of support from everyone, including government, healthcare providers, employers, the media, family, and friends which empowers and enables each family toward successful breastfeeding outcomes; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Maryland citizens are encouraged to breastfeed their children and work to protect, promote, and support breastfeeding families by aligning with international, national, and Maryland goals, including those of the United States Surgeon General, the federal Healthcare Reform laws, and the Maryland Hospital Breastfeeding Policies, as well as the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the majority of health care professionals.*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LAWRENCE J. HOGAN, JR., GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, do hereby proclaim AUGUST 2020 as BREASTFEEDING MONTH in Maryland, and call upon our citizens to join in this observance.
